MISSION

The Providence College Board of Advisors (BOA) will play a critical role in helping the College achieve its strategic vision on many levels, including academic, student co-curricular, and philanthropic initiatives while offering counsel and assistance in elevating the national reputation of PC.

OVERVIEW

The BOA consists of a group of community and business leaders who can assist in the advancement of the mission of Providence College. The Board will serve as a resource to the President, Board of Trustees, and senior administration of the College on matters related to strategic planning, career exploration and experiential learning, philanthropy, and other operational initiatives. The Board will offer opportunities for its members to become familiar with the College's progress and challenges and thus be better able to offer counsel and assist in the growth and advancement of Providence College.

MEMBERSHIP

The Board will be comprised of 35-40 members who meet the overall membership criteria. The Board strives to maintain a balance of membership; therefore, gender, race, age, industry and geography will be considered in recruiting members. Members are expected to serve a three-year term, renewable for an additional term, based on needs and mutual consideration.

Members are committed to making a minimum annual contribution of \$10,000 to support a designation of their choice. Additionally, members are highly encouraged to participate in annual fundraising campaigns and to assist in the fulfillment of the needs of the College.

ENGAGEMENT RESPONSIBILITIES

The Board will meet in person two times per year (fall and spring), to coincide with large-scale College events. Two virtual meetings will be scheduled to augment the in-person meetings and introduce the Board to matters of importance to the President and the Board of Trustees.

The Board may establish sub-committees as needed and membership on a minimum of one committee is strongly encouraged for all members. Additional engagement opportunities include presenting in a class or course, participating on a panel, mentoring students and faculty, and assisting with experiential learning that enhances student success.
